




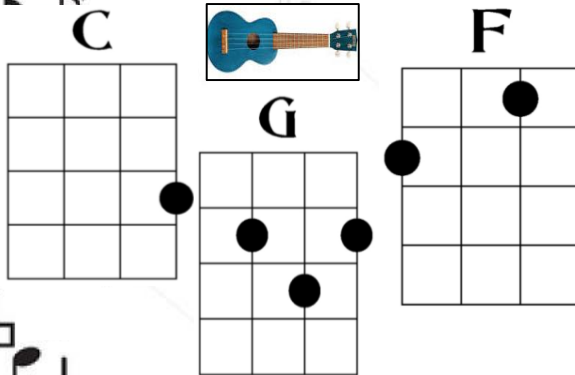

Musical Language	
Dynamics	Expression and volume
Pulse	Steady underlying beat in music
Rhythm	Patterns of long and short notes in sound and silence
Tempo	Speed of the pulse
Duration	Length of sounds and silences
Pitch	High and low sounds
Melody	Pattern of pitched notes making a tune
Notation	Visual representation of music
Ostinato	Repeating pattern in music
Harmony	Extra notes played with the tune
Genre	Categories of music which share a style

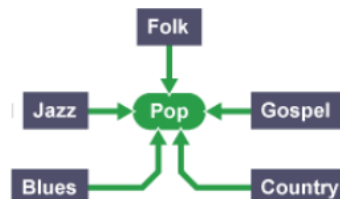
